Church Leadership

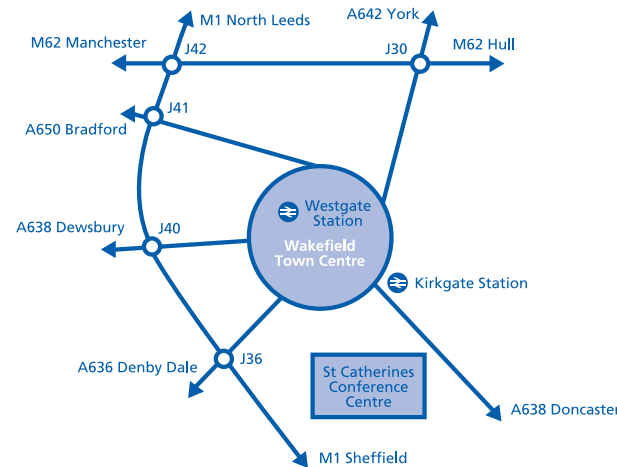

## Getting There\_

**By Train\_** Wakefield Westgate station is approx. 2 miles from the venue. A taxi costs around £4. Some trains also stop at Kirkgate which is around 15 minutes walk away.



## Churches Regional Commission for Yorkshire and the Humber\_

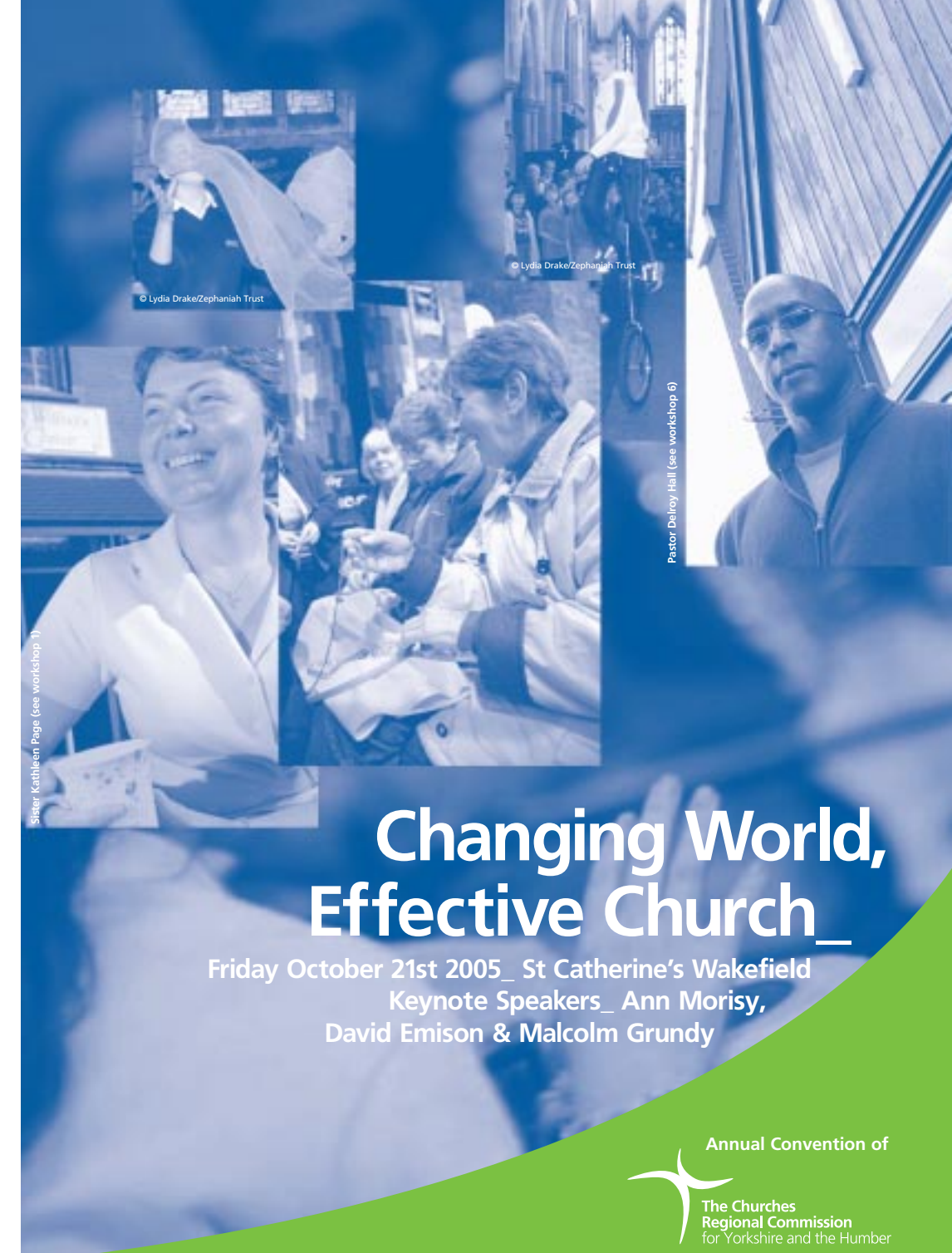
